O R D E R

BREA TOWNSITE COMPANY, having made application to the Railroad Commission for authority to sell to the City of Brea the properties described in Exhibit "A" attached to the petition herein, and to be relieved from its obligations as a public service corporation in the event that the sale of its properties is consummated, and the City of Brea having agreed to purchase said properties and pay for the properties as they existed on July 1, 1920, the sum of \$37,500 plus such an additional amount as may represent the cost of additions and betterments installed since July 1, 1920, together with the cost of all meters owned by said Company or contracted for, and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a proceeding in which a public hearing is necessary and that this application should be granted:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application of Brea Townsite Company be, and it is hereby, granted subject to the following conditions:

1. The properties shall be sold and transferred subject

to the terms and conditions set forth in Exhibit "A" attached to the petition herein.

2. The authority herein granted to transfer property shall apply only to such transfer as may have been made on or before February 1, 1921. Within 30 days after the execution of the instrument of conveyance, a certified copy of such instrument shall be filed with the Railroad Commission.

3. Within 10 days from the date on which Erea Townsite Company actually relinquishes possession and control of the properties herein authorized to be transferred, said company shall file with the Railroad Commission a statement indicating the date on which such control and possession was relinquished.
