ORDER

PETROLEUM PRODUCTS CO., a corporation, engaged in refining oil and by-products at a point near the city of Martinez, Contra Costa County, California, having applied to the Railroad Commission for approval of a wharf franchise duly granted by the Board of Supervisors of Contra Costa County, as required by section 2906 of the Political Code of this State, complete data, setting forth the details of said application, including profile maps, etc., having been submitted with the application showing that the construction of said proposed wharf will in no wise interfere with navigation; and it appearing to the Commission that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not required:

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Railroad Commission of the State of California approve the said franchise, subject to the following condition:

That this order shall not become effective until Petroleum Products Co. shall file with this Commission a stipulation agreeing that neither itself, nor its successor or assigns will ever claim before the Railroad Commission of the State of California or other public body, any value for said permit granted by said Board of Supervisors of Contra Costa County, in excess of the actual cost thereof, which cost shall be stated in the stipulation; and shall have secured from this Commission a supplemental order declaring that such stipulation, satisfactory in form to the Commission, has been filed.
