Petitioners in this proceeding having applied to the Railroad Commission for authority to abandon and permanently discontinue the operation of telegraph service heretofore maintained between Chinese Camp, Sonora, and intermediate points in Tuolumne County, and it appearing that as a result of a fire which destroyed a portion of petitioners' system, during the month of July, 1918, service was suspended and has not since been resumed; and no protest having been made to this Commission, against the discontinuance of said service; and it appearing to this Commission that public convenience and necessity do not require further continuance of said service, that this is not a matter requiring a public hearing; and that the application herein should be granted,
