FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

WHEREAS, under date of March 24, 1921, B. L. Halverson filed herein a protest against the granting of a certificate of public convenience and necessity to applicant herein and requested a rehearing in this proceeding as regards the findings of the Railroad Commission, as contained in Decision Number 8707 on Application Number 6494 as decided March 4, 1921, and,

WHEREAS, since the filing of the protest and application for rehearing, a stipulation has been filed in this proceeding by applicant, R. R. Young, that an amended order in this proceeding may be issued.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, That the portion of the Commission's order in Decision Number 8707, as referring to application Number 6494, decided March 4, 1921, and reading as follows;

"The Railroad Commission Heroby Declares, That public convenience and necessity require the operation ***** and by R. R. Young of passenger stage service between Oakdale and Don Pedro Bar, serving Waterford, Robert's Ferry and La Grange as intermediate points, *****"

be cancelled on the authority as contained in stipulation of R. R. Young, as hereinabove referred to and that the order in this proceeding be and the same hereby is amended to read as follows:

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES, That public convenience and necessity require the operation by R. R. Young of passenger stage service between Oakdale and Don Pedro Dam Camp serving on eastbound trips the intermediate community of Waterford. No authority is hereby conveyed for the serving of any business locally between Waterford and Don Pedro Dam Camp, such portion of the route already being served by the stage line operated by B. L. Halverson; the proposed through rate between Stockton and Don Pedro Dam Camp shall be not more than three and 50/100 dollars (\$3.50).

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, That in all other respects the conditions of the order, as contained in Decision Number 8707 on Application Number 6494, as decided March 4, 1921, remain unchanged and continue in full force and effect.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED , That by reason of the stipulation of R. R. Young hereinabove mentioned as being filed in this proceeding that the petition for rehearing, as filed herein under date of March 24, 1921, be and the same hereby is dismissed.
