BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

The Railroad Commission, having by Decision Number 8737, dated March 14, 1921, authorized Los Angeles Gas and Electric Corporation, to issue and sell \$2,500,000.00 of its Series "A" 5-year 7% general and refunding mortgage bonds, due March 1, 1926, subject among others, to the condition that none of the bonds shall be delivered until the Commission by supplemental order has authorized Los Angeles Gas and Electric Corporation to execute a mortgage or trust deed securing the payment of the bonds; and Los Angeles Gas and Electric Corporation, having filed with the Commission a copy of its proposed trust deed, and having asked permission to execute a trust deed substantially in the form as the trust deed filed with the Commission on April 27th, and the proposed trust deed being in satisfactory form;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Los Angeles Gas and Electric Corporation be, and it is hereby, authorized to execute a trust deed substantially in the same form as the trust deed filed with the Railroad Commission on April 27, 1921 in the above entitled matter, provided that the authority herein granted to execute a trust deed is for the purpose of this proceeding only and is granted in so far as this Commission has jurisdiction under the terms of the Public Utilities Act and is not intended as an approval of said trust deed as to such other legal requirements to which said trust deed may be subject.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED, that the order in Decision Number 8737, dated March 14, 1921, shall remain in full force and effect, except as modified by this First Supplemental Order.
