O P I N I O N

By above application, William Becker and William Bern-  
 stein, as partners under the name of Becker & Bernstein, apply  
 for authority to operate a milk hauling service between Los An-  
 geles and Corona.

Public hearings upon the application were held by Ex-  
 aminer Westover at Los Angeles and Corona.

The territory which applicants wish to serve includes  
 the Corona district and extends east to the Riverside limits,  
 west to Central Avenue, Chino, and north to a road extending  
 easterly at right angles with the south end of said Central Avenue.

The application alleges inadequate rail service and no  
 truck service or pick-up and delivery. It appears from the tes-  
 timony, however, that all the territory in question is satisfactorily

served by Myrtle Anderson, except the westerly four miles of the road on the north limits (the total distance between Central Avenue and the Riverside limits being 15 miles); and that the four miles in question is served by J. H. McKee. The present carriers have ample facilities to care for the traffic.

ORDER

Public hearings having been held on above application, the matter being submitted and now ready for decision,

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity do not require the service proposed by applicants.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the application be and it is hereby denied.
