Written request has been made by the applicant for authority to discontinue the operation of an automobile stage line as a common carrier of passengers between Concord and Avon, California, authorized by the Railroad Commission in its Decision No. 8127, on Application No. 6030, rendered September 23, 1920, for the reason that applicant has become disabled through a stroke of paralysis and is unable to personally operate said service on account of such disability and that the revenue received will not justify the employment of help to operate such service.

The granting of this application will cause no inconvenience to the public, inasmuch as the route is now covered and we believe this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this application be and the same hereby is granted.

The applicant will immediately cancel his tariff and

time schedule in accordance with the provisions of General Order
No. 51 and other regulations of the Railroad Commission.
