FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER
FOR TERMINATION OF EMERGENCY RATE

WHEREAS, the Commission by its prior order herein made the 27th day of May, 1920, Decision No. 7637, fixed and prescribed the rates to be thereafter charged and collected by the applicant as an emergency rate, which the Commission found to be reasonable during an emergency due to shortage of water supply, and which rates were required by said order to be continued in effect until the further order of this Commission; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to said prior order of the Commission herein applicant has caused to be filed with this Commission monthly financial statements showing revenues received from the sale of water each month under said emergency rates, together with a statement showing the amount of revenue which the Company would have received from the sale of water under the regular rates of the company; and it appearing therefrom that the amount of revenue received by the applicant under said emergency rates in excess of the amount which applicant would have realized under the rates theretofore in effect has been sufficient to defray the excess costs of service due

to said emergency, and that the necessity for said emergency rates no longer exists;

NOW, THEREFORE, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that upon the termination of the operating month of June, 1921, the emergency rates fixed and prescribed by the Commission's prior order herein, Decision No. 7637, shall be suspended and thereafter applicant shall charge and collect its regular rates in accordance with the schedules filed by it with this Commission on May 1, 1914, and June 11, 1915.

The effective date of this order is hereby fixed and designated as the first day of July, 1921.
