THIRD SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY, having asked permission to sell certain properties described herein to the City of Pasadena pursuant to the terms of an agreement executed under the authority granted in Decision Number 7707, dated June 9, 1920, and the Commission having considered the request of the Southern California Edison Company, and being of the opinion that such request should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA EDISON COMPANY be, and it is hereby, authorized to sell and transfer to the City of Pasadena the following described properties;

"All those certain lands in the County of Los Angeles, State of California, described as Lot Thirteen(13), Block "C" Huntington Drive Tract Number One, as per Book 5, page 17, of Maps, Los Angeles County Records.

All rights of way and easements, local distributing sub-station equipment, poles, towers and accessories, transformers and line devices, service meters, lighting equipment, and all other equipment and installations owned by the company and operated within said territory. Also all commercial and engineering records used or useful in the location, identification, operation and maintenance of said distributing system and in furnishing electric service by means of said system."

said sale and transfer to be made pursuant to the terms of the agreement executed under the authority granted in Decision Number 7707, dated June 9, 1920 and the conditions set forth in the Third Supplemental Application filed on June 30, 1921 in the above entitled matter.
