BY THE COMMISSION,

O R D E R

In this proceeding Henry Hanson has applied jointly with A. E. Marx for permission to transfer to the latter his rights to operate an automobile truck line between San Francisco and San Rafael and intermediate points.

The rights herein proposed to be transferred were obtained by Henry Hanson by operation in good faith prior to May 1st, 1917, and continuously since. No equipment is proposed to be transferred, the agreement of sale providing for the transfer of the operative rights only for the sum of \$500.00.

It appearing to the Commission that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be, and the same hereby is granted subject to the following conditions:

1. That the amount to be paid for the operative rights herein proposed to be transferred shall never be urged before this Commission or any other rate fixing body as a measure of value for rate fixing or any other purpose other than the transfer herein authorized.

2. That applicant Henry Hanson will be required to immediately cancel all tariffs and time schedules now on file with the Railroad Commission, such cancellation to be in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 51 and other regulations of the Railroad Commission.

3. That applicant A. H. Marx will be required to immediately file tariff and time schedule, in duplicate, in his own name, or to adopt as his the tariffs and time schedule heretofore filed with the Railroad Commission by applicant Henry Hanson, all rates and time schedules to be identical with those filed by applicant Henry Hanson.

4. That the rights and privileges herein authorized to be transferred may not be discontinued, sold, leased, transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such discontinuance, sale, lease, transfer or assignment has first been secured.

5. That no vehicle may be operated by applicant A. H. Marx, unless such vehicle is owned by said applicant or is leased by him under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
