BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER.

By its decision and order, heretofore rendered, December 24, 1920, herein, the Commission authorized The Union Water Company of California to sell, and the East Bay Water Company to buy, a certain public utility water system. As a condition of the order, however, it was required that the transfer be completed on or before April 1, 1921. The above named utilities and the other applicant, The Union Water Development Company, now join in an application filed the 4th day of August, 1921, wherein they state that it was impossible to complete the necessary financial arrangements to conclude the transfer within the time specified in the order, and ask that the order be amended to permit additional time to and including October 1, 1921, to complete the transfer. The Commission is of the opinion that this request is a reasonable one and should be granted. The utilities affected having joined in the application, it is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary.

ORDER

It is hereby ordered that the Commission's Decision No. 8491, heretofore rendered herein, December 24, 1920, be amended by striking out that portion of the order set forth as

condition No. I, appearing in the following words and figures:

"I. That the transfer herein authorized shall be completed on or before April 1st, 1921;"

and substituting in lieu thereof the following:

"I. That the transfer herein authorized shall be completed on or before October 1st, 1921."

The decision and order heretofore made, December 24, 1920, shall in all other respects remain unchanged.
