O P I N I O N

In this proceeding William Giminiani has made application to the Railroad Commission in which he petitions that the Commission grant him a certificate of public convenience and necessity authorizing the operation of an automobile stage line for the transportation of passengers, baggage and express between Bakersfield and Arven Store serving as intermediate points Union Avenue Plunge, Greenfield Store, Weed Patch.

Subsequent to the filing of such application a protest against the granting of the same was filed by the Arven Farms Center and the matter was thereupon set for hearing for August 18th, 1921, at Bakersfield before Examiner Satterwhite at which time the matter was submitted and is now ready for decision.

At such hearing, applicant testifying in his own behalf, stated that the route which he intends to serve is at the present time without transportation facilities of any kind whatsoever, except by private conveyances, that in connection with his stage line at present being operated between Bakersfield and Buttonwillow, he has received numerous requests from residents along the proposed route that he extend his service so as to serve the points named

in the present application.

Inasmuch as protestants herein have filed a written statement withdrawing such protest and the territory in question is without public transportation facilities, we are of the opinion that the application should be granted.

O R D E R

A hearing having been held upon the above entitled application, the matter being submitted and the Commission being fully advised,

IT IS HEREBY DECLARED that public convenience and necessity require the operation by William Giminiani of an automobile stage line for the transportation of passengers, baggage and express between Bakersfield and Arven Store, serving as intermediate points Union Avenue Plunge, Greenfield Store and Weed Patch, and a certificate of public convenience and necessity be, and the same hereby is granted subject to the following conditions:

1. That the applicant, William Giminiani will file with the Railroad Commission a written acceptance of this certificate within ten (10) days from the date of service hereof, that applicant will file tariff of rates and time schedules, in duplicate, within thirty (30) days from date hereof, in accordance with the provisions of General Order No. 51 and other regulations of the Railroad Commission, and that applicant shall begin operation of the service herein authorized within a period of thirty days from date hereof. In all other respects the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from date hereof.

2. That the rights and privileges herein authorized may not be discontinued, sold, leased, transferred nor assigned unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to such discontinuance, sale, lease, transfer or assignment has first been secured.

3. That no vehicle may be operated by the applicant, William Giminiani, unless such vehicle is owned by said applicant or is leased by him under a contract or agreement on a basis satisfactory to the Railroad Commission.
