F.G. Matthiessen has applied to the Railroad Commission for a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate freight truck service between Owensmouth, Zelzah, and Chatsworth and intermediate points in Los Angeles County.

A hearing was held by Examiner Williams at Los Angeles.

This hearing was completed in the belief that a part of the route proposed by applicant was outside the municipal boundaries of the City of Los Angeles, but the proof did not support this. The points named are all in the City of Los Angeles and hence no certificate as prayed for is required of applicant.

For this obvious lack of jurisdiction, the application should be dismissed.

ORDER

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA
HEREBY DISMISSES said application for want of jurisdiction.
