OPINION

A public hearing was held by Examiner Westover at Santa Cruz upon the above application for authority to operate a freight truck service between San Francisco, Santa Cruz and intermediate points between Los Gatos and Santa Cruz, upon schedule providing three round trips per week.

Upon testimony produced on behalf of the Southern Pacific Company and the American Railway Express Company, it appears that they are providing a satisfactory service, with no complaints on the part of shippers.

The applicant did not appear in person or by attorney, although due notice had been given of the hearing to applicant, to his attorney and to all others who appear from the Commission's records to be interested in the subject matter of the application.

ORDER

A public hearing having been held upon the above entitled application, the matter being submitted and now ready for decision,

THE RAILROAD COMMISSION HEREBY DECLARES that public convenience and necessity do not require the operation by Herman Johanson of a freight truck service between San Francisco and Santa Cruz or any intermediate points.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above application be and it is hereby denied.
