O R D E R

LUCERNE WATER COMPANY engaged in the business of furnishing water for irrigation purposes in the vicinity of Grenada, Siskiyou County, California, having filed application with the Railroad Commission for authority to transfer its property, more particularly described in Exhibit "A" attached to the application, to the Grenada Irrigation District, an organization formed under the CALIFORNIA IRRIGATION ACT for the purpose of taking over said system, the consideration to be \$130,000, par value, in bonds of the said Grenada Irrigation District and the Grenada Irrigation District having joined in the application and it appearing to the Commission that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Lucerne Water Company be and it is hereby authorized to transfer its system to the Grenada Irrigation District subject to the following conditions:

1. The property herein authorized to be transferred and the reservations obtaining are as described in Exhibit "A", attached to the application and made a part thereof.

2. The authority herein granted to transfer public utility property shall apply only to such conveyance as may have been made on or before June 30, 1922, and a certified copy of the instrument of conveyance shall be filed with the Commission by the said Lucerne Water Company within thirty (30) days from the date on which it is executed.

3. Within ten (10) days from the date on which Lucerne Water Company actually relinquishes control of property herein authorized to be transferred, said company shall file with the Railroad Commission certified statement indicating the date on which such control or possession was relinquished.
