it to abandon a portion of its line  
of railroad within the said City of  
Turlock and near or adjacent thereto.

BY THE COMMISSION:

SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Tidewater Southern Railway Company, a corporation,  
having on September 12, 1921, filed with the Commission an appli-  
cation for an order authorizing it, among other things, to aban-  
don a portion of its line of railroad within the City of Turlock,  
County of Merced, as hereinafter indicated and it appearing to  
the Commission that this is not a case in which a public hearing  
is necessary and that this application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED, that permission be and it is  
hereby granted Tidewater Southern Railroad Company to abandon cer-  
tain existing tracks in the said City of Turlock, described as  
follows, and as more specifically shown on Exhibit "B" attached to  
the application:

FIRST: Commencing at a point of connection with  
the present passing track of the Tidewater  
Southern Railway Company on Castor Street

near Locust Street and terminating on private property at or near the westerly line of Lander Avenue, crossing Locust Street and intervening alley:

SECOND: Commencing at a point of connection with the present side track of the Tidewater Southern Railway Company on "B" Street between Fifth and Fourth Street and terminating on private property, near the westerly line of the alley in the block bounded by "B", "C", Fourth and Third Streets and crossing "B" Street and Fourth Street.
