OPINION and ORDER

B.P. Mc Connaha, operating under the fictitious name of Humboldt Motor Stages by virtue of Decision No. 24786, dated May 23, 1932, on Application No. 17991, has made application to suspend operations between Weaverville Junction and Trinidad via Crannall. Applicant gives as his reason for suspension lack of patronage, as shown by the revenues of April 1933, which amounted to but 2.2¢ per bus mile, there being carried but 24 passengers, the total revenue being \$10.06. Also, that the operations between Eureka and Crannall amounted to but 3.5¢ per bus mile, with a total revenue of \$7.03 for 16 passengers carried. Applicant also alleges that the logging operations at Crannall have been discontinued and travel to and from this point has ceased until the operations may be resumed. Applicant seeks authority to suspend the schedules and operations effective May 20, 1933 until further order of the Commission or until traffic conditions warrant resumption.

This is a matter in which we believe a hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that B.P. Mc Connaha, operating under the name Humboldt Motor Stages be and he is hereby authorized to suspend all operations between Weaverville Junction and Trinidad via Crannall, effective May 20, 1933, said suspension to continue until such time as applicant is warranted by traffic to resume

service or until further order of this Commission, provided, however, that applicant shall post notice at least five (5) days before discontinuance at his terminals and in his vehicles of the date of discontinuance, and concurrently file supplement to tariff and a new time schedule canceling the service discontinued.
