

Decision No. 26107.

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, on June 16, 1933, applied for authority to abandon its non-agency station of Call of the Wild, located on its College Park-Santa Cruz Branch of its Coast Division in Santa Clara County, California.

Applicant alleges that there was no passenger or freight business transacted at said non-agency station during the two years ending April 30th, 1933; and that, in applicant's opinion, the continued maintenance of the non-agency is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public.

The nearest existing agencies to Call of the Wild are Felton, 12.1 miles to the south, and Los Catos, 6 miles to the north and the nearest non-agency stations are Wright, 1 mile to the south and Eva, .3 miles to the north.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to abandon its non-agency station of Call

of the Wild, located on its College Park-Santa Cruz Branch of its Coast Division, in Santa Clara County, State of California, to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records and to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said station; subject to the following conditions:

- (1) The public shall be given not less than ten (10) days notice by posting a suitable sign in a conspicuous place at said non-agency station.
- (2) Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.
- (3) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
