BY THE COMMISSION: OPINION In this proceeding Southern California Telephone Company requests the Railroad Commission for an order granting it a certificate that public convenience and necessity require the exercise by it of the rights and privileges conferred upon it under the franchise granted by the City Council of the City of Escondido by Ordinance No. 293 on the 7th day of Merch, 1933. A hearing in the application was held before Examiner Fry in San Francisco, on August 14, 1933, when the matter was submitted for decision. Applicant is now, and for many years past has been, engaged in a general telephone and telegraph business in the City of Escondido and elsewhere in Southern California. Mr. Marshall, attorney for applicant, stated that the acquisition of the certificate requested would not affect the rates or rules and -1-

regulations of applicant's service in the City of Escondido. Counsel stipulated that Southern California Telephone Company would mever claim or urge in any rate proceeding before the Commission any value for said franchise No. 293 greater than One hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.), which was the amount paid therefor. No objection was made to the granting of the application, which appears to be in the public interest. ORDER Southern California Telephone Company having requested the Railroad Commission for an order granting it a certificate that public convenience and necessity require the exercise by it of certain rights and privileges conferred on it by Ordinance No. 293 on the 7th day of March, 1933, by the City of Escondido, a copy of said ordinance having been filed with the application, a public hearing having been held, the matter having been submitted for decision, THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA hereby declares that public convenience and necessity require the exercise of the rights and privileges granted under said franchise, and IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a certificate of public convenience and necessity be and the same is granted to Southern California Telephone Company authorizing the exercise by it of the rights and privileges granted it by the City Council of the City of Escondido by Ordinance No. 293, dated March 7, 1933. The authority herein granted is subject to the condition that: Southern California Telephone Company shall never claim -2or urge any value for said franchise No. 293 greator than One hundred twenty-five dollars (\$125.), which is the emount paid therefor.

For all other purposes the effective date of this order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
