FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Commission having issued its Decision No. 25941 on the fifteenth day of May, 1933, in the above entitled proceeding, wherein it was provided that a supplemental order would be issued granting James J. Roddy a certificate of public convenience and necessity to operate a water system in a tract of land known as San Pedro Terrace by the Sea, also known as Pedro Valley, said tract being located in San Mateo County as more particularly set forth and delineated upon that certain map designated as Exhibit No. 3 herein and made a part of this Order by reference, upon the condition that applicant file with this Commission a certified copy of a franchise, permit or consent from the County of San Mateo granting him permission to construct, operate and maintain a water system in and in the vicinity of the subdivided tract known as San Pedro Terrace by the Sea, and applicant having obtained said franchise which is designated as Ordinance No. 394 of the County of San Mateo and having filed a certified copy of same with this Commission, it is, therefore,

The Railroad Commission of the State of California hereby declares that public convenience and necessity require that James

J. Roddy exercise the rights and privileges granted to him by said Ordinance No. 394 of the County of San Mateo in and for the operation of a public utility water system supplying residents in and near San Pedro Terrace by the Sea, or Pedro Valley, as more particularly set forth and delineated upon that certain map designated as Exhibit No. 3 herein, provided applicant herein file with this Commission, on or before thirty (30) days from the date of this Order, an affidavit to the effect that said applicant, his successors or assigns will never claim for said franchise a value in excess of the actual cost of securing it.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the schedule of rates as set forth in Decision No. 25941, dated the fifteenth day of May, 1933, shall become effective and may be charged for all service rendered on and after the date the above affidavit is filed with this Commission.

For all other purposes, the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
