O R D E R

Railway Express Agency, Inc., a corporation, filed the above application on October 21, 1935, requesting authority to discontinue its agency at Incline, on the line of railroad of Yosemite Valley Railroad Company, Mariposa County.

The application states that the nearest agency stations on each side of Incline are El Portal, five miles east, and Merced Falls, forty-nine miles west, and that during the twelve-month period ending February 28, 1933, 387 shipments producing a revenue of \$306.00 were handled at said station.

It appears that due to the accidental death of the person acting as its agent at said station, there is at present no express agent at Incline and the company has been unable to secure anyone else to represent it at this point.

Applicant states that the discontinuance of the agency will not involve the elimination of service in its entirety, for express shipments moving into or out of that point will be handled by the express messenger on trains stopping at this point.

It appears that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that the application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Railway Express Agency, Inc., is hereby authorized to discontinue its agency at Incline, Mariposa County, and to change its station records and tariffs accordingly, provided that said station shall be continued as a non-agency station and that applicant continue to handle express shipments moving into or out of said station provided they are received from or tendered to the express messenger at the car door of trains stopping at said point.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
