OPINION

ORIGINAL

Mrs. Henry Graham, otherwise Gertrude Graham, has made application for a motor carrier transportation agent's license in compliance with Chapter 390, Statutes of 1933.

A public hearing was conducted by Examiner Kennedy in Los Angeles, November 15, 1933.

Applicant expects to sell tickets for nine carriers, all of whom have complied with the regulations of operation imposed by this Commission. In addition, at the hearing, applicant amended her application to include Nevix-Grandic Stages. Applicant has been engaged in selling transportation since 1928. The Board of Public Utilities and Transportation of the City of Los Angeles stated it had no objection to the granting of the application. It appears, therefore, that the applicant is a fit and proper person to receive such license and an order granting same will be entered.

Applicant is not now authorized to sell tickets for Pacific Greyhound Lines, Inc. but included it in the application because she thought arrangements therefor might be made with this carrier.

ORDER

Gertrude Graham, operating under the name of Mrs. Henry Graham, having made application to engage in the business of "Motor Carrier Transportation Agent," and the Commission being fully advised, the Secretary of the Commission is hereby ordered and directed to issue to the applicant named above a license to engage in the business of "Motor Carrier Transportation Agent" as such is defined by Statutes 1933, Chapter 390, at the following location:

228 South Hill Street (Astor Hotel) Los Angeles, California,
and subject to the following conditions:

1. That applicant shall first file a bond in the sum required by law and in the form prescribed by the Railroad Commission of the State of California, and
2. A copy of this Order, and supplements thereto, shall be kept open at all times for public inspection, and
3. The authority herein conveyed is for the sale of transportation over the lines of the Motor Carriers named in Provision 4, below,
