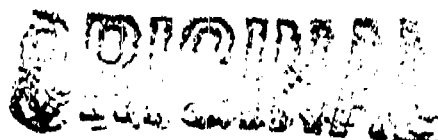


Decision No. 28870



BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the Matter of the Application of  
the City of Mountain View for an  
Order authorizing the widening and  
altering of the crossing of the rail-  
road right-of-way of the Southern  
Pacific Railroad Company by Castro  
Street and Stierlin Road.

Application No. 19182.

BY THE COMMISSION:

O R D E R

The City of Mountain View, by its Mayor A. J. Knight, has made application for authority to alter and widen the crossing of Castro Street and Stierlin Road with the track of Southern Pacific Company.

In Application No. 18000, filed March 1, 1932, and amended May 4, 1932, applicant proposed similar alterations to this crossing and, after hearing, the Commission made its Decision No. 25003 denying said Application No. 18000, stating, in effect, that the record showed the highway traffic needs were better served by the existing crossing than would be the case with the one proposed by applicant and that the Commission believed it undesirable to disturb existing conditions.

There is nothing in the instant application to show that conditions have changed since the hearing on the prior application and as it appears that no good cause would be served by again reviewing the same situation, Application No. 19182 will also be denied, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled appli-  
cation be and it is hereby denied, without prejudice.

The effective date of this order shall be twenty (20)  
days from the date hereof.
