ORDER on REHEARING

By its Decision No. 26691, herein, dated January 3, 1934,
the Commission granted to applicant a certificate of public
convenience and necessity to engage in the business of a cold
storage warehouseman. Thereupon Pacific States Cold

Storage Warehousemen's Association et al., protestants, filed
their petition for rehearing and the Commission having given
full consideration to said petition for rehearing, and now
being fully advised,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the order in said Decision
No. 26691 herein, paragraph two thereof, be and it is hereby
amended to read as follows:

"IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that a certificate of public con-
venience and necessity be and it is hereby granted to applicant,
Overland Terminal Warehouse Company, a corporation, for the
maintenance of approximately 30,000 square feet of cold storage
service, to be maintained at a temperature of 32 to 40 degrees
Fahrenheit only, provided, however, applicant shall receive
in such storage only cheese (except cottage cheese), in
packages; fruits, dried, preserved and glazed (in bulk, in
boxes or bags), nuts in shell, or shelled, in packages, and
no other commodities, and subject to the following conditions -."

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that said petition for rehearing
be and the same hereby is denied.
