BY THE COMMISSION:

ORDER DENYING REHEARING AND MODIFYING
PRIOR ORDER

L. R. Kagarise having filed a petition and a supple-
mental petition for a rehearing of Decision 26786, and J. Nelson
Kagarise having also petitioned for a rehearing of said decision,
the Commission having carefully considered said petitions and
each of the allegations therein contained, and being of the
opinion that no good cause has been shown for the granting of
a rehearing, IT IS ORDERED that said petitions are hereby denied.

Good cause appearing, IT IS FURTHER ORDERED:

(1) That the next to the last paragraph of the
order in Decision 26786 is hereby amended to read as follows:

"IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that J. Nelson Kagarise, doing business as Keystone Express Company, shall immediately cease and desist operating as an 'express corporation' or 'freight forwarder' over the lines of L. R. Kagarise (Keystone Express System) between points located on the latter's routes numbered 10 to 50, inclusive, on the one hand, and Los Angeles and points between Los Angeles and San Gabriel Boulevard on the other hand; or to or from any points located on said routes 10 to 50, inclusive, unless in accordance with the existing operative rights of L. R. Kagarise as construed herein."

(2) That a true copy of this order be personally served upon J. Nelson Kagarise.

(3) Decision 26786, as amended herein, shall become effective twenty days from date hereof.
