O P I N I O N

By orders dated January 22, 1934, and February 26, 1934, in the above entitled proceeding the Commission suspended until April 1, 1934, Warehouse Tariff No. 4, C.R.C. No. 4 of F. C. Johnson, Panama Warehouses, naming rates for the warehousing of various commodities including liquors and wines. The tariff was suspended upon protests from competing warehousemen alleging that respondent was not authorized to store liquors and wines. Thereafter respondent informed the Commission that it desired to withdraw the suspended tariff. Permission to do so was granted by the Commission, and the schedule cancelled on March 10, 1934. The cause for suspension has therefore been removed, and our orders of January 22 and February 26, 1934, should be vacated and this suspension proceeding discontinued.

Upon consideration of all the facts of record, and good cause appearing therefor,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that our orders of January 22, 1934, and February 26, 1934, in the above entitled proceeding, suspending the operation of Warehouse Tariff No. 4, C.R.C. No. 4 of F. C. Johnson, Panama Warehouses, naming rates for the warehousing of various commodities including liquors and wines, be and they are vacated and set aside and this proceeding discontinued.
