26920 Decision No. BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA. In the Matter of the Application of the County of Sonoma, a political subdivision of the State of Cali-fornia, and Joint Highway District Application No. 19329. No. 19 of the State of California, a public corporation, for permission to relocate crossing of public high-way with railroad. BRIGINAL BY THE COMMISSION: ORDER The Board of Supervisors of the County of Sonoma and Joint Highway District No. 19, State of California, on February 23, 1934, applied for authority to relocate a public road at grade across the track of Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company in the vicinity of Monte Rio, in said County of Sonoma. Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company on March 18, 1934 signified, in writing, that it has no objection to the relocation of said crossing at grade. The County proposes to relocate the road on each side of the railroad as well as the crossing so as to improve the highway alignment and improve the approaches to the crossing.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein; that it is neither reasonable nor practicable at this time to provide a grade separation or to avoid a grade crossing with said track at the points mentioned and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the Board of Supervisors of

the County of Sonoma and Joint Highway District No. 19, State of California, are hereby authorized to construct a public road at grade across the track of Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company, at the location more particularly described in the application and as shown by the map attached thereto, subject to the following conditions and not otherwise: The above crossing shall be identified as Crossing No. 5M-78.0.. The entire expense of constructing the crossing shall be borne by applicants. The cost of maintenance of that portion of said crossing outside of lines two (2) feet outside of the outside rails shall be borne by applicant. The maintenance of that portion of the crossing between lines two (2) feet outside of the outside rails shall be borne by Northwestern Pacific Railroad Company. (3) The crossing shall be constructed of a width of not less than twenty-four (24) feet and at an angle of approximately eighty (80) degrees to the railroad and with grades of approach not greater than four (4) per cent; shall be constructed equal or superior to type shown as Standard No. 2 in our General Order No. 72; shall be protected by two (2) Standard No. 1 crossing signs, as specified in our General Order No. 75-A; and shall in every way be made suitable for the passage thereon of vehicles and other road traffic. (4) Prior to the beginning of actual construction of the crossing herein authorized, applicant, County of Sonoma, shall file with the Commission a certified copy of an appropriate ordinance or resolution, duly and regularly passed, instituting all necessary steps to legally abandon and effectively close the existing public grade crossing located one hundred and eighty (180) feet east of the crossing herein authorized and identified as Crossing No. 5M-78.0. Upon the completion of the crossing herein authorized and upon its being opened to public use and travel, said Crossing No.5M-78.0 shall be legally abandoned and effectively closed to public use and travel. (5) Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days there-after, notify this Commission, in writing, of the completion of the installation of said crossing and of its compliance with the conditions hereof. -2-

- (6) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.
- (7) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, public convenience and necessity demand such action.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
