FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Upon petition filed by California Farm Bureau Federation, Inter-Regional Dairy Department, and Independent Milk Producers' Association, the Commission reopened the above entitled proceedings for further hearing to determine whether or not Decision 26709 of January 8, 1934, wherein applicants were authorized to increase certain rates for the transportation of milk and cream shown in their respective tariffs should be rescinded, altered or amended.

A public hearing was had at Los Angeles. Petitioners however presented no evidence, and it not appearing that there is any good cause why the order in Decision No. 26709 should be rescinded or modified,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Decision No. 26709 of January 8, 1934, in the above entitled proceedings shall remain in full force and effect.
