O P I N I O N

By order in the above entitled proceeding dated October 23, 1933, and as extended, the Commission suspended until May 26, 1934, reduced rates for the transportation of groceries and grocery supplies from Los Angeles to San Luis Obispo, Santa Maria, Lompoc and White Hills, named in Item 750-I, 9th Revised Page 35 of Pacific Motor Transport Company's Local Express Tariff No. 9, C.R.C. No. 13. The rates were suspended upon a protest from a competing common carrier alleging that they were noncompensatory, unduly discriminatory and detrimental to its interests.

Thereafter respondent informed the Commission that it desired to withdraw the suspended rates. Permission to do so was granted by the Commission and the rates are being cancelled, effective May 26, 1934. Upon the cancellation of these rates the cause for suspension will therefore have been removed and our order of October 23, 1933, and as extended should be vacated and this suspension proceeding discontinued.

O R D E R

Upon consideration of all the facts of record, and good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that our order of October 23, 1933, and as extended, in the above entitled proceeding, suspending reduced rates for the transportation of groceries and grocery supplies from Los Angeles to San Luis Obispo, Santa Maria, Lompoc and White Hills, published in Item 750-I, 9th Revised Page 35 of Pacific Motor Transport Company's Local Express Tariff No. 9, C.R.C. No. 13, be and it is hereby vacated and set aside as of May 26, 1934, and this proceeding discontinued.
