In the above entitled matter Pacific Gas and Electric Company asks this Commission to make its decision and order declaring that public convenience and necessity require and will require the exercise by applicant of the right and privilege granted to it by Ordinance No. 43 of the City Council of the City of Soledad, County of Monterey.

A public hearing was held in San Francisco, California, before Examiner McCaffrey on May 24, 1934, at which time testimony was introduced and the matter submitted for decision. No one appeared at the hearing to protest the granting of the application.

The evidence submitted shows that applicant is and for some time past has been serving and distributing electrical energy to its consumers in the City of Soledad and that public convenience and necessity require and will require the exercise by applicant of the right and privilege granted to it under the Ordinance to which

reference is made herein and that the exercise of such right and privilege will not conflict with the right and privilege of any other public utility.

Applicant has stipulated to the effect that it, its successors or assigns, will never claim before the Railroad Commission of the State of California, or before any court or other public body, any value for the aforesaid franchise in excess of the actual cost thereof, which cost is \$236.15.

Pacific Gas and Electric Company having applied to the Railroad Commission of the State of California for an order declaring that public convenience and necessity require and will require the exercise by applicant of the right and privilege granted to it by the Ordinance to which reference is made in the foregoing Opinion, a public hearing having been held and the Commission having considered the record in this application and being of the opinion that the application should be granted,

The Railroad Commission of the State of California Hereby Orders and Declares that public convenience and mecessity require and will require the exercise by Pacific Gas and Electric Company of the right and privilege granted to it by Ordinance No. 43 of the City of Soledad, County of Monterey, as fully set forth and described in Exhibit "A," attached to and made a part of the application herein, provided that the Railroad Commission of the State of California may hereafter, by appropriate proceedings and orders, revoke or limit, as to territory not then served by Pacific Gas and Electric Company, the authority herein granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that this order shall become
