OPINION AND ORDER

In this proceeding the Commission is asked to make an order authorizing the transfer to Pacific Transportation and Warehouse Company, Inc., of all the rights to conduct a public warehouse, business and property of O. C. Butler and Harold A. Grundy, doing business under the fictitious name of Pacific Transportation Company.

By Decision 21852 of December 2, 1929, in Application 15535 applicants O. C. Butler and H. A. Grundy, copartners, were authorized to operate a public warehouse at 625 East 62nd Street, Los Angeles, for the warehousing of certain designated commodities. At the time they were also engaged in the transportation of freight by auto truck between Los Angeles and Wilmington. On December 27, 1933, they, together with the Pacific Transportation and Warehouse Company, Inc., filed an application (No. 19107) whereby the copartners requested authority to sell and the corporation to acquire the operating rights and equipment used in the transportation oper-

tions. Authority to do so was granted by the Commission in Decision 26477 of October 30, 1933.

Applicants allege that at the time Application 19107 was filed, the fact that the warehousing operations were covered by a separate and independent certificate was overlooked. They desire now to transfer the warehouse operating rights, properties and business to the corporation so that the entire business may be conducted under the corporate name.

It appears that this is a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary and that the application should be granted; therefore

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the above entitled application be and it is hereby granted, subject to the following conditions:

1. O. C. Butler and Harold A. Grundy, copartners, and the Pacific Transportation and Warehouse Company, Inc., shall unite in common supplement to the tariff now on file with the Commission, O. C. Butler and Harold A. Grundy, copartners, withdrawing and Pacific Transportation and Warehouse Company, Inc., accepting and adopting such tariff and all effective supplements thereto.
2. The rights and privileges herein authorized to be transferred may not be sold, leased, transferred or assigned, nor service thereunder discontinued, unless the written consent of the Railroad Commission to the sale, lease, transfer or discontinuance has first been secured.

The authority herein granted will become effective upon the date hereof.
