

Decision No. 27324.

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the Matter of the Application of SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY for authority to (a) abandon the non-agency station of Worthing, in the County of Tulare, State of California, and (b) to abandon and remove the side track approximately 765 feet in length, located at said station.

O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, on August 18, 1934, applied for authority to abandon its non-agency station of Worthing, located on its main line in Tulare County, and to remove a side track approximately 765 feet in length, shown in yellow on a blue print map attached to the application.

Applicant alleges that no passenger or freight business was transacted at said non-agency station since January 1, 1932, and that, in applicant's opinion, the continued maintenance of the non-agency is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to abandon its non-agency station of Worthing, in Tulare County, State of California; to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records; to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said station; and to remove a side track approximately 765 feet in length.

Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
