

Decision No. 27820.

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

The NEVADA COUNTY NARROW GAUGE RAILROAD COMPANY, by W. A. Wenneson, its General Freight Agent, hereby applies under Section 63 of the Public Utilities Act, for an order abandoning the following stations, and eliminating all rates quoted to and from the stations of Cedar Kress, 11.0 miles from Colfax, and Mitchell's Crossing, 17.5 miles from Colfax (between Grass Valley and Glenbrook).

Nevada County Narrow Gauge Railroad Company, a corporation, on November 26, 1934, applied for authority to abandon its non-agency stations of Cedar Kress and Mitchell's Crossing, in Nevada County.

Applicant alleges that no business was transacted at either of said non-agency stations during the twelve months preceding the filing of the application and that, in applicant's opinion, the continued maintenance of the non-agencies is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public. It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Nevada County Narrow Gauge Railroad Company is hereby authorized to abandon its non-agency stations of Cedar Kress and Mitchell's Crossing, in Nevada County, State of California, to eliminate said non-agency names from its station records and to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said stations.

Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
