ORDER VACATING ORDER OF SUSPENSION AND INVESTIGATION

By order in the above entitled proceeding dated April 22, 1935, the Commission suspended until August 19, 1935, rates for the transportation of wool and mohair and wool or mohair tags between points in California published in Supplement 30 to Pacific Freight Tariff Bureau Tariff 196-B, C.R.C. No. 515 of F. W. Gomph, Agent. The rates were suspended following receipt of protests from The River Lines, the Sacramento and Stockton Chambers of Commerce and the Stockton Port District.

Protestants now advise that under existing circumstances the suspension of these rates will serve no useful purpose and^{ask} that their objections be considered withdrawn. Therefore, good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that our order of April 22, 1935, in the above entitled proceeding, suspending the operation of the aforesaid schedule, be and it is hereby vacated as of May 1, 1935, and this proceeding discontinued.
