In the matter of the application of Crestmore Water Company, for permission to abandon one certain well and certain pipe lines from its system and service.

OPINION AND ORDER

Wallace S. Woodworth, the owner and operator of Crestmore Water Company supplying domestic water to five consumers in the townsite of Crestmore, San Bernardino County, has applied to the Commission for authority to have relieved from public utility obligation a certain well and pipe lines heretofore occasionally used for service to said consumers but now no longer necessary. It is desired to have said properties relieved from public utility service obligation in order that certain ranch lands owned by said Wallace S. Woodworth may be embraced within a trust deed in favor of the Security First National Bank of Los Angeles. Adequate service can be rendered to the five consumers through another well and distribution system. Attached to the application is a petition signed by all of said consumers agreeing to the request herein.

An investigation has been made and it appears that

a public hearing in this matter is not necessary and that the application should be granted, now, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Wallace S. Woodworth, owner and operator of Crestmore Water Company, be and he is hereby authorized to discontinue further public utility service by and through the well and all pipe lines lying north of Thirteenth Street and west of Cedar Avenue in the townsite of Crestmore, San Bernardino County, on and after the date of this Order.

For all other purposes, the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
