FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

In its Decision No. 23408, dated February 16, 1931,

in the above numbered application, this Commission ordered as follows:

"(1) That Southern Counties Gas Company of California shall file with this Commission on or before March 10, 1931, a stipulation duly executed upon authority of its Board of Directors that applicant, its successors or assigns will never claim before the Railroad Commission, or any other body or court, a value for such franchise in excess of the actual cost thereof.

"(2) Upon the filing in satisfactory form of the stipulation and agreement, the Commission will issue its supplemental order authorizing the exercise by applicant of the rights and privileges granted by franchise under Ordinance No. C-1011 of the City of Long Beach."

Applicant having on February 24, 1931, filed a satisfactory stipulation, as mentioned above, and having stated that the actual cost of said franchise granted by the City of Long Beach was \$183.97;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Counties Gas Company

of California be and it is hereby granted permission to exercise the rights and privileges granted to it by Ordinance No. C-1011 of the City of Long Beach, referred to in this Commission's Decision No. 23408, provided that the Railroad Commission may hereafter, by appropriate proceedings and orders, revoke or limit as to territory not then served by applicant, or its successors in interest, the authority herein granted.

In all other respects Decision No. 23408 shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this Order shall be the date hereof.
