O R D E R

SOUTHERN PACIFIC COMPANY, a corporation, on April 23, 1935, applied for authority to cancel all freight rate tariffs to and from its non-agency station of Zayante, located in Santa Cruz County.

Applicant alleges that at present said Zayante is published as a station at which freight in carload lots or in quantities not exceeding five thousand (5000) pounds, (no piece to be larger than two men can handle), will be received or delivered; that there has been no carload freight shipments, and only a small amount of less than carload freight shipments, handled at said Zayante Station during the past two (2) years, and that the cancellation of all freight rate tariffs to and from said Zayante Station and the discontinuance of the handling of freight at said Station will not involve the abandonment of any facilities.

The California Farm Bureau Federation, on May 14th, 1935, signified, in writing, that it does not object to the granting of this application. It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to cancel all freight rate tariffs to and from its non-agency station of Zayante, in Santa Cruz County, State of California.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
