

Decision No. 28348.

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the Matter of the Application of the People of the State of California, on relation of the Department of Public Works, for an order authorizing the construction of a crossing at grade of the state highway and the tracks of the Southern Pacific Railroad at Grass Lake, County of Siskiyou, State of California.

**ORIGINAL**

The People of the State of California, on relation of the Department of Public Works, on March 4, 1935, applied for authority to construct a state highway known as Road II-Sis-72-B, at grade across the wye track of Southern Pacific Company, in the vicinity of Grass Lake, County of Siskiyou, State of California. Southern Pacific Company, on May 4, 1935, signified, in writing, that it has no objection to the construction of said crossing at grade.

This matter has been investigated by our Transportation Division and our engineers recommend that the application be granted, provided the crossing is protected by flashing light signals.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein; that it is neither reasonable nor practicable at this time to provide a grade separation or to avoid a grade crossing with said track at the point mentioned; and that the application should be granted,

~~IT IS HEREBY ORDERED~~ that the People of the State of California, on relation of the Department of Public Works, are hereby authorized to construct Road II-Sis-72-B at grade across the wye track of Southern Pacific Company in the vicinity of Grass Lake,

County of Siskiyou, State of California, at the location as shown by the map (Exhibit "A") attached to the application, subject to the following conditions and not otherwise:

- (1) The above crossing shall be identified as Crossing No. CF-368.6-C.
- (2) The entire expense of constructing the crossing shall be borne by applicant. The cost of maintenance of that portion of said crossing outside of lines two (2) feet outside of the outside rails shall be borne by applicant. The maintenance of that portion of the crossing between lines two (2) feet outside of the outside rails shall be borne by Southern Pacific Company.
- (3) The crossing shall be constructed of a width of not less than twenty-four (24) feet and at an angle of approximately eighty-five (85) degrees to the railroad and with grades of approach not greater than three (3) per cent; shall be constructed equal or superior to type shown as Standard No. 2 in our General Order No. 72; and shall in every way be made suitable for the passage thereon of vehicles and other road traffic.
- (4) Two (2) Automatic flashlight signals shall be installed at the sole expense of applicant for the protection of said crossing, the maintenance of which shall thereafter be borne by Southern Pacific Company.
- (5) Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the completion of the installation of said crossing and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.
- (6) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof, unless further time is granted by subsequent order.
- (7) The Commission reserves the right to make such further orders relative to the location, construction, operation, maintenance and protection of said crossing as to it may seem right and proper, and to revoke its permission if, in its judgment, public convenience and necessity demand such action.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
