EY THE COMMISSION:

<u>O P I N I O N</u>

This is an application by Alton W. Hall for a cortificate of public convenience and necessity to supply water in the territory comprising sixty-three acres, more or less, of land near the town of Arcadia in Los Angeles County.

A public hearing in this matter was held before Examiner MacKall at Los Angeles.

Applicant has two separate distribution systems obtaining water from the same well. One supplies domestic service through steel pipe mains under pressure; the other distributes water for agricultural irrigation purposes through a cement pipe line. Portions of the tracts to be served have been subdivided into lots approximating two-thirds to three-quarters of an acre each. At present there are five houses on the tract receiving domestic water and five consumers receiving irrigation water, making a total of ten.

The plant consists of a main pump located at the well

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and a booster pump, a 10,000-gallon storage tank and a pressure tank of 2,000 gallons' capacity used for domestic service, together with the distributing mains. All pipe lines are laid in private casements and for this reason no county franchise is necessary at this time.

Applicant has also asked that a schedule of rates be established for the service to be rendered. The rate schedule proposed is reasonable for both domestic and irrigation service under present conditions and, as no consumers appeared to protest the granting of this application, the requests will be approved in the following Order.

ORDER

Alton W. Hell having applied as above entitled for authority to operate a water works and for the establishment of rates to be charged for the service rendered, a public hearing having been held thereon, the matter having been submitted, and the Commission being now duly advised in the premises,

The Railroad Commission of the State of California hereby declares that public convenience and necessity require that Alton W. Hall operate a water works for the distribution of water for domestic, irrigation and other purposes in Lot No. 31 and a portion of Lot No. 32 of the E.J. Baldwin Addition No. 1 to Santa Anita Colony and Tract No. 8822, County of Los Angeles, as such territory is more specifically set forth and described in the application herein and the map attached thereto which are hereby made a part of this Order by reference.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order Alton W. Hall file with this Commission

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the following schedule of rates to be charged for all service rendered to his consumers on and after the <u>lst</u> day of November _____, 1935.

DOMESTIC SERVICE

Meter Rates:

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Monthly Minimum Charge, entitling the consumer to 1,000 cubic feet-----\$1.50 All over 1,000 cubic feet, per 1,000 cubic feet----- .75

AGRICULTURAL IRRIGATION SERVICE

Flat Rate Charge, per hour run of pump------\$1.00

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Alton W. Hall be and he is hereby directed to file with this Commission, within thirty (30) days from the date of this Order, rules and regulations to govern relations with his consumers, said rules and regulations to become effective upon their acceptance for filing by this Commission.

For all other purposes, the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
