FOURTE SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The applicant herein has requested an extension of
time for the transportation of fresh meats and meat products
under refrigeration between Eureka and Willits for delivery
to the Quartermaster Warehouse, Camp Northwestern, Willits,
California. The sale and delivery of fresh meats to the
Quartermaster's Warehouse is handled on a month to month
basis and this service is of a temporary emergency nature
and it appears that the request should be granted.

Good cause appearing,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that paragraph three (3) on
page two (2) of Decision No. 28140 dated July 29, 1935, on
the application herein, be and the same hereby is amended to
read as follows:

"Applicant shall be permitted to transport at a rate of fifty (50) cents per one hundred (100) pounds, fresh meat and meat products, southbound only, between Eureka and Willits, delivering same to the Quartermaster Warehouse, Camp Northwestern, Willits, California, until December 1, 1935 or such further time as may be granted by subsequent order."

In all other respects said decision shall remain in full force and effect.

The effective date of this order shall be the date hereof.
