Decision No. 20257.

BEFORE THE RAILROAD COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA.

In the Matter of the Application of the COUNTY OF TULARE for an order authorizing the establishment of a grade crossing over the tracks of the Southern Pacific Company, at a point where the north section line of Section 30, Township 18 South, Range 24 East intersects the Southern Pacific Company tracks, and at which point a former crossing was known as B-239.9.

BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

Applicant, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Tulare, on August 14, 1935, filed with this Commission a certified copy of a resolution requesting that condition (4) of Decision No. 27743, dated February 11, 1935, be modified so that Crossing No. B-239.1, located at Goshen Junction, may be allowed to remain open for a limited period after the opening of Crossing No. B-239.9, located south of Goshen Junction, as authorized in the above mentioned decision.

Applicant alleges that the closing of said crossing No. B-239.1 at the present time would work a hardship and inconvenience upon the inhabitants residing north and east of the railroad tracks, until the relocation of the town of Goshen is completed.

Southern Pacific Company advised the Commission in writing that it was not opposed to allowing said Crossing No. B-239.1 to remain open for a limited period.

It appears that this is not a matter in which a public

hearing is necessary and that the request should be granted,
therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Condition (4) of Decision
No. 27743 be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

- (4) Prior to the beginning of actual construction of the crossing herein authorized, the County of Tulare shall file with this Commission a certified copy of an appropriate ordinance or resolution, duly and regularly passed, instituting all necessary steps to legally and effectively close the existing public grade crossing in the vicinity of Goshen Junction Station and identified as Crossing No. B-239.1. Said Crossing No. B-239.1 may remain open to public use and travel until the first day of November, 1938. On that date, or any date prior thereto, applicant shall cause said crossing to be legally abandoned and effectively closed to public use and travel.

In all other respects said Decision No. 27743 shall remain in full force and effect.
