O R D E R

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, on January 18, 1936, applied for authority to abandon its non-agency station of Molitor, located on its Salt Lake Division, in the County of Lassen, State of California.

Applicant alleges that no passenger or freight business was transacted at said non-agency station during the two-year period ending October 31, 1935, and that, in its opinion, the continued maintenance of the non-agency is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public.

The California Farm Bureau Federation, on January 22, 1936, signified, in writing, that it does not object to the granting of this application.

It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to abandon its non-agency station of

Molitor, located on its Salt Lake Division in Lassen County, State of California, to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records and to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said station, subject, however, to the following conditions:

- (1) Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.
- (2) The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
