ORIGINAL

Sacramento River Farms, Ltd., a corporation, the owner of a public utility water works serving consumers generally in and in the vicinity of the Town of Hamilton City, Glenn County, California, having asked for permission to abandon its present well source of water supply and the parcel of land upon which said well is located and to substitute therefor a new well and tank situated on another tract of land, a field investigation having been made and the Commission being of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a public hearing is necessary and that this application should be granted as herein provided, now, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Sacramento River Farms, Ltd., a corporation, be and it is hereby authorized to abandon its present well situated on land more particularly described in Exhibit "A" of the application herein which is made a part hereof by reference and to substitute therefor a new well on land more particularly described in Exhibit "B" of the application which is also made a part of this Order by reference.

The authority herein granted is subject to the following term and condition:

1. The authority herein granted shall become effective only when the new well being drilled on land described in Exhibit "B" and the installation of pumping and storage facilities are completed and in satisfactory operation and the Railroad Commission duly notified thereof by certified statement.

For all other purposes, the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
