<u>O P I N I O N</u>

C. G. Lusher, doing business as Orange Packet Line, has made application to the Railroad Commission for an order authorizing him to discontinue and abandon all service for the automotive transportation as a highway common carrier of freight and express between Escondido, Valley Center, Woods Valley, Bear Valley and intermediate points, and for a further order revoking his operating right.

As justification for such authority applicant Lusher alleges an insufficient volume of traffic to warrant his continued operation. His annual report for the calendar year 1935, on file with the Commission, shows no revenue for the year. Decision No. 27597 authorized a temporary suspension of applicant's service until July 1, 1935.

This appears to be a matter in which a public hearing is not necessary. The application will be granted.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that C. G. Lusher be and he is hereby authorized to discontinue and abandon all automotive service for the transportation as a highway common carrier of freight and express between Escondido, Valley Center, Woods Valley, Bear Valley and intermediate points.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that all tariffs and time schedules, now on file with this Commission therefor, be and they are hereby cancelled.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that Decision No. 19779 dated May 18, 1928 in Application No. 14526 be and it is hereby rovoked and annulled.
