## ORDER

Southern Pacific Company, a corporation, on February 13, 1936, applied for authority to abandon its non-agency station of Dry Lake, located in Modoc County.

A statement accompanying the application states that no business was transacted at said non-agency station during the years 1934 and 1935; and the application recites that, in applicant's opinion, the continued maintenance of the non-agency is not necessary for the business of applicant or for the public.

The California Farm Bureau Federation, on February 18, 1936, signified, in writing, that it does not object to the granting of this application. It appearing that a public hearing is not necessary herein and that the application should be granted,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern Pacific Company is hereby authorized to abandon its non-agency station of Dry Lake, in Modoc County, State of California; to eliminate said non-agency name from its station records; and to cancel, in conformity with the rules of this Commission, all rate tariffs and time schedules applying at said station.

Applicant shall, within thirty (30) days thereafter, notify this Commission, in writing, of the abandonment of the facilities authorized herein and of its compliance with the conditions hereof.

The authorization herein granted shall lapse and become void

if not exercised within one (1) year from the date hereof unless further time is granted by subsequent order.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
