ORDER

General Pipe Line Company of California asks permission to transfer and deliver to General Petroleum Corporation of California all of its assets, real, personal or mixed, wherever situated, consisting of pipe lines, pumping stations, rights of way, franchises, fee lands and all equipment and material necessary or proper in the ODETation of its pipe lines. Its trunk lines consist of an S-inch line from Midway to Emidio Pump Station, two 8 inch lines from Emidio Pump Station to Lebec Pump Station, an 8 inch line from Lebec Pump Station to Mojave, a 10 inch line from Lebec Pump Station to Fremont Junction, a 10 inch line from Fremont Junction to Torrance, an 8 inch line from Fremont Junction and an 8 inch line from Torrance to San Pedro and an 8 inch line from Torrance to San Pedro.

All of the outstanding stock of the General Pipe Line Company of California is owned by the General Petroleum Corporation of California. Upon the transfer of the aforesaid property the stock will be cancelled. General Petroleum Corporation of California agrees to carry out all rates, orders and regulations contained in California Railroad Commission rate sheet No. 9 effective June 14, 1932, in relation to the operation of the pipe lines of General Pipe Line Company of California until the same shall be changed by order

of the Railroad Commission, and assume all liabilities of the General Pipe Line Company of California.

The Commission has considered applicant's request and is of the opinion that this is not a matter in which a hearing is necessary and that this application should be granted, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that General Pipe Line Company of California be, and it is hereby, authorized to sell and transfer to the General Petroleum Corporation of California all of its assets, real, personal or mixed, wherever situated, and consisting of pipe lines, pumping stations, rights of way, franchises, fee lands and all equipment and material necessary or proper in the operation of said pipe lines.
