OPINION AND ORDER

Applicant has on file with the Commission tariffs naming rates (1) for the transportation by vessel of forest products between Eureka and other points on Humboldt Bay on the one hand, and San Francisco, Los Angeles Harbor and other points in California on the other, and (2) for carloading service performed at San Francisco Bay points. By application filed March 25, 1936, it seeks to withdraw from and abandon entirely these services.

Applicant alleges that at the time these tariffs were filed it was anticipated that tonnage would be available in sufficient volume to justify the performing of the service. The anticipated traffic, however, did not develop. In fact, no service has been performed under these tariffs since they were filed.

The granting of the application will not deprive the public of transportation or carloading service for the territory is served by other carriers and stevedoring companies.

It appears that this is not a matter in which a public hear-

ing is necessary and that the application should be granted. Therefore,

IT. IS HEREBY ORDERED that Schafer Bros. Steamship Lines be and it is hereby authorized to withdraw from and abandon entirely its common carrier service by vessel and its carloading service.

The authority herein granted shall become effective on the date hereof.
