O P I N I O N

San Joaquin Light and Power Corporation has filed with the Commission revised sheets Nos. 199-G to 204-G inclusive to supersede and take the place of existing revised sheets 190-G, 191-G, 196-G, 194-G, 197-G and 198-G, respectively, covering the service of natural gas on its system. It has requested that these revised schedules be made effective on May 1, 1936 on less than the regular thirty days' notice.

The blocking in the revised schedules has been changed to conform to that of the schedules of Pacific Gas and Electric Company. While this change has brought about the condition that for monthly domestic consumption in excess of 209,300 cubic feet under Schedule GD-3, Sheet 201-G, and in excess of 120,000 cubic feet under Schedule GD-10, Sheet 203-G, the monthly bills would be increased over the present superseded schedules, the increase is technical only, for the reason that should any domestic consumer ever reach these high consumptions, the reductions in the lower blocks would more than offset any increase.

It is estimated that the revised schedules will effect an annual reduction in revenue amounting to approximately \$96,000.00. We are of the opinion that in so far as these schedules may result in increased rates, such increases are justified.

O R D E R

IT IS ORDERED that San Joaquin Light and Power Corporation be and it is hereby authorized to publish upon less than thirty (30) days' notice, effective May 1, 1936 revised schedules of rates for the service of gas being C.R.C. Nos. 199-G to 204-G filed April 17, 1936.
