BY THE COMMISSION:

FIRST SUPPLEMENTAL ORDER

The Railroad Commission by Decision No. 28843, dated May 25, 1936, authorized Lyon Van & Storage Co., a corporation, to issue a note in the principal amount of not exceeding \$32,550. with interest on the principal amount at the rate of six percent. per annum, principal and interest payable in installments of \$150. or more per month, payable on the 15th day of each month to and including February 15, 1939.

The company now asks the Commission to amend its order so as to permit the issue of the note with the principal payable in monthly installments of \$150. or more, and with interest on the unpaid balances payable monthly in addition to the payment on the principal amount.

The Commission has considered this request and believes it should be granted, so therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the order in Decision No. 28843, dated May 25, 1936, be, and it hereby is amended so as to permit Lyon Van & Storage Co. to issue the \$32,550. note referred to in said decision with the principal payable in installments of \$150. or more per month and with interest on the unpaid balances payable monthly in addition to the principal payments, said monthly payments to continue to February 15, 1939, when the entire balance of principal and interest

then unpaid shall become due and payable, said note to be in form substantially the same as that filed in this proceeding as a part of Exhibit B.

IT IS HEREBY FURTHER ORDERED that the order in Decision No. 28843, dated May 25, 1936, shall remain in full force and effect, except as amended by this First Supplemental Order.
