OPINION AND ORDER

Southern California Telephone Company, a corporation,
in this application requests permission to change certain of its
filed tariffs.

The application relates that in connection with recent
reductions in exchange service rates authorized by the Commission
certain schedules showed certain unintended reductions due to
errors in printing. In these schedules, identified as Sheets
C.R.C. Nos. 22288-T, 22289-T, 22354-T, 22355-T, 22356-T, 22357-T,
22358-T and 22360-T, filed with the Commission there appears
this rate:

"Not on same premises as switching
equipment and not more than 300
feet, circuit measurement, from
switching equipment, above rates
plus \$0.50."

Applicant desires to restore the rate superseded by
the above rate, which was as follows:

"Not on same premises as switching
equipment and not more than 300
feet, circuit measurement, from
switching equipment, above rates
plus \$0.75."

The Commission has considered this application and is
of the opinion that the request should be granted and that this
is a matter in which a public hearing is not required, therefore,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Southern California Telephone Company is authorized to:

- (1) Change the rates set forth on the C.R.C. Sheets referred to above on or before September 1, 1936.
- (2) Submit to the Railroad Commission for filing in accordance with General Order No. 68, the rate referred to in the opinion, on or before the Fifth day immediately preceding the date upon which said rate is to be made effective.

For all other purposes the effective date of this Order shall be twenty (20) days from and after the date hereof.
